






Request to Speak (RTS)




What is Request to Speak (RTS)?

- The Request to Speak (RTS) system is an online tool that lets you give Arizona State legislators your feedback on bills.
- RTS allows you to register your support or opposition on a bill and provide the reason why.
- You do not have to speak as the name implies.
- It's an easy way to share your opinions directly with legislators, all from the comfort of your home or office!



Good news: this is the last week to introduce bills, so the flow should slow dramatically from here out.

Bad news: education is under siege by Arizona's own Betsy DeVos, Senator Debbie Lesko (R-21). The Legislature is fast-tracking her empowerment scholarship (voucher) expansion bill and other bills which would gut public education in Arizona. We have limited time. We must redouble our efforts to stop these bills! Reproductive rights, our environment, clean elections, and the disability community all need our help too. (Looking at you, SB1367!)

You may be asking: WHAT CAN I DO?


- → Top priority: the three Urgent Alerts below. Use Request to Speak when possible, contact your House and Senate representatives now with your opposition, and attend committee meetings if you can to speak in person.
- → If you have 20-30 minutes: call/email your legislators on the bad bills headed to a floor vote, and scan the RTS listings to support or oppose bills in committee. Senate / House contact info.
- → If you have 45-60 minutes: call legislators to advance important bills not yet assigned to committee. This is the last week we can move these bills, or they are dead.

URGENT ALERT #1 — OPPOSE SB1174 & SB1431 by Monday AM


Both of these bills are headed for the Senate Rules Committee on Monday at 1 PM. If they pass out of Rules (which tends to be a rubber stamp), they head to the floor. They may come up for votes later this week... and bad bills are harder to stop once they leave the Senate.

SCM1009: Urges the removal of the gray wolf from Endangered Species listings. Scheduled for Monday in Natural Resources Committee. OPPOSE

SCM1011: Asks Congress to repeal/amend the Antiquities Act to remove large swaths of Anzona land from national monument designation. Scheduled Monday, Natural Resources Committee. OPPOSE. + comment - short sighted bud for fitne 58 AZ

SB1122: Prohibit local government from requiring anyone to search a national database in order to transfer personal property. Scheduled for Senate Government committee Wednesday, 2/8, OPPOSE

SB1198: Would greatly weaken ability to enforce the ADA in Arizona and restricts civil rights of the disabled. Businesses and public places have had over 30 years to comply with the ADA and do not need any further leeway. Strongly opposed by the disability community. Assigned to Senate Judiciary Transces have had & deepole to comply of ADA Committee for Thursday OPPOSE.

SB1210: Expands ability of Attorney General to investigate any political subdivi cities/counties, to see if they are breaking a state or federal law. OPPOSE

SB1253: Allows police to review video of a use-of-force incident before making a statement, in violation of recommended best practices of many civil rights groups. Passed Senate Commerce and Public Safety Committee last week, headed for Rules on Monday OPPOSE 15

SB1315: Gives preference in custody to the parent who agrees to 50% time sharing. It harms battered


